

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




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DEDICATION



At some time in a free man's life, a time comes when he is called upon to do as John F. Kennedy said. To this, the men of today's generation are dedicated here in Vietnam. And this, in its part of the effort, the men of CBMU 301 are doing.

These men are paying the price by leaving loved ones, friends, and what we now know as the beautiful life. They are bearing the burden by living a war, and meeting the hardship by living and working in conditions from heat and dust to rain and mud. They are working long hours — supporting our friends by teaching our skills and a better standard of living, and opposing any foe by supporting the combat units in their efforts. These men now have tangible evidence to add to their knowledge of the meaning of freedom.

To them, the men of CBMU 301, we dedicate this book: their story in the insurance of our country's freedom.

BATTALION HISTORY

The United States, early in World War II, recognized the need for men qualified in professional and military skills to maintain advanced operating bases which the Seabee Mobile Construction Battalions had already established. Thus, in the fall of 1942, the first maintenance units were formed with the task of maintaining public works, public utilities and operating power plants, utility distributing systems, and transportation equipment at advance Naval Operating Bases. The Second World War saw 136 Seabee Construction Units throughout the advance bases of the Atlantic and Pacific.

When the war ended in the autumn of 1945, most of the construction units were inactivated amidst the ensuing demobilization of a major portion of the Armed Forces. However, a few units survived and during the postwar period served at U. S. Naval Bases in the Aleutian Islands, Alaska proper, and Guam. But by the end of the decade, these, too, had been inactivated.

With the coming of the Korean Conflict, CBMU's were again employed to provide advance base maintenance. CBMU 1 was activated and served the First Marine Air Wing in Korea and then returned to Japan after the end of the conflict. It was redesignated CBMU 101 and continued to serve in Japan until March, 1965. At that time it was inactivated and separate maintenance units no longer existed.


After the lapse of eleven years, the need again arose for maintenance units, this time in the Republic of Vietnam. Mobile Construction Battalions had been used to fulfill the requirements of Navy and Marine Corps Units in the war zone, but in keeping with the large construction efforts in South Vietnam, the MCB's again found the need for maintenance units. Thus CONSTRUCTION BATTALION MAINTENANCE UNIT THREE ZERO ONE came into existence.

It was late in December 1966 that the detailing of personnel to the 31st Naval Construction Regiment in Port Hueneme, California, began. By March 31, 1967, the men were established as the U.S. Naval Construction Battalion Maintenance

Unit 301. The Unit was formally commissioned in ceremonies on April 7, 1967, with LCDR H. A. Holmes as Commanding Officer upon receiving the unit flag from Commissioning Officer RADM E. T. Riech, Director, Logistic Plans Division, Office of the Chief of Naval Operations.

Deployed to Dong Ha, RVN, the CBMU 301 main body with its details at Khe Sanh, An Hoa, Cua Viet, and Quang Tri, began its task of maintenance of the vital combat bases of the Northern I Corps in South Vietnam. The Unit is also involved with select new construction projects.



BATTALION LOG

Construction Battalion Maintenance Unit 301 was undergoing its largest transition from the "Old Blood" to the "New." It was most evident on June 3, 1968, in the relief of Commanding Officer LCDR H. A. Holmes, CEC, USN by CDR W. E. Burdick, CEC, USN.

The change of command ceremony commenced immediately following the formation of troops and arrival of the official party. The invocation, led by LT J. F. Kirstein, Chaplain Corps, JSNR and the national anthem complemented the opening moments. With the presentation of awards to the outstanding men of the Unit, LCDR Holmes gave his final remarks and reading of orders. CDR Burdick completed the core portion of the ceremony with the reading of his orders and first remarks to the Command. Upon the passing of the Unit Colors, LT Kirstein pronounced the benediction and CDR Burdick began his task as Commanding Officer of CBMU 301.

Commander Burdick graduated from the University of Chicago with a Bachelor of Philosophy Degree. He then attended Lehigh University where he graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering.

In May 1955, Commander Burdick graduated from the Officer Candidate School and received his commission as Ensign in the Civil Engineer Corps. He was sent by the Navy to Stanford University where he earned his Masters in Economics. Since graduating from Stanford, CDR Burdick has served at



MAIN BODY

The mission of the Main Body is the maintenance of the 3,700 foot AM-2 aluminum runway at Dong Ha. It is also tasked with the maintenance of Marine and Navy cantonments, over 17 miles of Base roads, the new and old LCU ramps, Base electrical distribution system and Base hospital.

The maintenance and operation of the 21,640 cubic foot Base reefer farm, the Base sanitary land fill and the Base fresh water supply system fall within the scope of 301's mission. In addition to maintenance functions CBMU 301 performs selected minor construction and provides combat support for the Base security system.

The CBMU is organized basically along the lines of a Naval Mobile Construction Battalion. Both an MCB and a CBMU have an end product to render whether it be construction or maintenance. The CBMU processes work input through its Operations Department which in a Public Works Department would correspond to a Maintenance Control Division. Work flow proceeds through the Operations Department to shop and field maintenance forces in the form of job orders.

Geographically the headquarters of CBMU 301 is located at Dong Ha Forward Combat Base, Republic of Vietnam, approximately eight miles south of the Demilitarized one. Dong Ha is in Quang Tri Province which is the northern most province in the I Corps Tactical Zone. The Dong Ha Base is a major source of ammunition, fuel and food for Marine outposts such as Con Thien, Khe Sanh, Camp Carroll and Gio Linh.



CBMU 301 is under the operational control of the Naval Support Activity, Da Nang and under the administrative control of the Commander, Construction Battalions, Pacific (COMCBPAC). Unlike the MCB's, CBMU 301 does not rotate between the States and Vietnam, but is homeported in Da Nang. Personnel are rotated individually as each man completes his one year tour of duty.

DETAILS

In addition to the Mainbody at Dong Ha, CBMU 301 has four details which are employed at other locations in the I Corps Area. Detail Alpha is located at An Hoa approximately 22 miles south of Da Nang. Detail Bravo is located at Khe Sanh. Detail Charlie is located at Cua Viet. Detail Delta is at Quang Tri 7 miles south of Dong Ha. There is also a few men serving as expeditors in Da Nang.


The primary mission of Detail Alpha is the maintenance of the 3,500 foot M8-A-1 matting airstrip. Secondary to this is the maintenance support of Marine and Naval shore units based there. This support encompasses maintenance of base cantonment facilities, maintenance of base electrical distribution system and generators and maintenance of base roads. Detail Alpha also performs selected minor new construction projects.

Detail Bravo, located at Khe Sanh, also has as its primary mission the maintenance of the 3,895 foot airstrip. Its secondary mission is that of maintenance support of Marine and Naval shore units on the base.




Detail Charlie is located at Cua Viet at the mouth of the Song Hieu Giang River which serves as an intermediate supply station for Dong Ha. Its primary mission is to maintain the landing craft ramp with a secondary mission of maintenance of Naval Units based there.





DEDICATION OF CAMP ADAMS




Towards the end of the Cruise Book year, CBMU 301 in following its maintenance program for the 3rd Marine Division, began to shift its Mainbody to their Detail Delta site in Quang Tri, corresponding with the progress of the Marine Division's move. April 1, 1969 was set as the official transfer date of the Battalion's Headquarters.



On April 16, 1969 CBMU 301 observed an official dedication ceremony declaring Detail Delta to be called Camp Adams in memory of their fallen workmate SWF2 Edward Cody Adams.

Petty-officer Adams died of shrapnel wounds exactly one year earlier while attached to CBMU 301's Detail Bravo at Khe Sanh.



The Commanding Officer of CBMU 301, CDR W. E. Burdick spoke at the ceremony, telling the story behind the name of the new camp. CDR Burdick reminded his men of the service they were performing for the United States, South Vietnam and the Free World.

CBMU 301 observed a moment of silence in memory of Petty-officer Adams and closed the ceremony in prayer with the Battalion Chaplain. The men returned to their work to continue to raise the CBMU 301 reputation and their new home, Camp Adams.



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


