



BORN 25 NOV. 1931, HE ENLISTED IN THE NAVY IN OCT. 1951 AND JOINED MCB-4 ON 26 JULY 1966. HE DIED ON 7 MARCH 1967 WHEN THE JEEP HE WAS DRIVING HIT A MINE BURIED IN THE ROAD NEAR AN HOA.

ROBERT E. KASPER CMH3

BORN 8 DEC. 1945, HE ENLISTED IN THE NAVY IN SEPT. 1965 AND JOINED MCB-4 ON 19 OCT. 1965. ON THE AFTERNOON OF 7 MARCH 1967, HE WAS SERVING AS PART OF A CONYOY TO AN HOA WHEN HE WAS KILLED BY A MINE IN THE ROAD.

LARRY R. RIDDLE CETS

BORN 4 AUGUST 1945, HE ENTERED THE NAVY IN AUGUST 1965 AND REPORTED ABOARD MCB-4 ON 22 SEPT. 1965. HE DIED ON 7 MARCH 1967 NEAR AN HOA, WHEN THE VEHICLE IN WHICH HE WAS RIDING STRUCK A MINE BURIED IN THE ROAD.

BORN 29 JUNE 1939, HE ENTERED
THE NAVY IN OCT. 1960 AND WAS

AT KHE SANH, WHEN HE DIED




classes during the first week as torrential rains made it virtually impossible for simulated combat activities. In the second week the schedule was doubled in order to complete all training on time.

Upon the Battalion's return to Port Hueneme, final preparations were made for mount-out and deployment to Vietnam.




MCB FOUR began departing from Pt. Mugu on 29 January 1967.

Headquarters Company, whether in support of construction crews, or as an important source of firepower for military operations, is an integral contributing member of MCB FOUR and proud of it.


