Part III

The KESTRELS deployed in January aboard FORRESTAL for an accelerated workup cycle in preparation for deployment to Southwest Asia during the Persian Gulf conflict. On 30 May 1991, VFA-137 embarked in FORRESTAL for the ship's final operational deployment. The squadron flew numerous sorties into Northern Iraq in support of Operation Provide Comfort following Operation Desert Storm. The KESTRELS and CVW-6 also participated in the NATO exercises "Display Determination" and "Iles D' Or". Both operations provided realistic multi-national scenarios and excellent training opportunities. 28 September 1991, CDR Charles T. Nash relieved CDR Craig B. Henderson as Commanding Officer in a ship board ceremony in port Antalya, Turkey. CDR Michael R. Groothousen assumed the duties as Executive Officer. squadron returned home to Jacksonville, FL 22 December 1991. VFA-137 has accumulated 23,000 accident free flight hours and is currently slated for a port change to NAS Lemoore, CA in October 1992.
